Bikes On Buses:

All buses in the TCAT fleet have a bicycle rack mounted on the front. These racks can help cyclists tame the hills and weather of Tompkins County. There is no additional fare for using the bike racks. **Bike racks are first come, first served. Each bus can carry 2 bikes. Some can now hold 3!** For safety reasons, the driver cannot get off the bus to assist you. See our schedule & service guide for instructions on how to load and unload your bike. Instructions are also located on each bike rack. All people using the rack must be strong enough to load and unload their bike. Children 10 or younger must be accompanied by an adult to load and unload bikes. Bike racks are used at your own risk.

Swipe Your Cornell ID at the Fare Box!

New-to-Cornell No-fee OmniRide: students matriculating for the first time receive free, automatic OmniRide privileges valid within their first academic year. This privilege is offered by Cornell as a way to introduce incoming students to the local public transit service. New-to-Cornell privileges expire each year on August 31 for Fall entrants; December 31 for Spring entrants.

All registered Cornell students: receive unlimited rides on all TCAT buses after 6 p.m. weekdays and anytime Saturday and Sunday. Students pay no fare when using their CU ID card at the fare box.

OmniRide: Purchase OmniRide and use your CU ID card at the fare box for unlimited rides on all TCAT buses any time they run, anywhere they go in Tompkins County. OmniRide is sold only by Cornell Transportation Services, 116 Maple Ave. or online at www.myparking.cornell.edu (Only registered students can use the online system to purchase an OmniRide pass.)

in compliance with the NYS mask mandate:

Masks are Still Required on TCAT Buses.

New York State continues the requirement for masking/face covering in certain indoor settings including public transportation. Until further notice, all riders are required to wear a mask before boarding and while riding the bus.

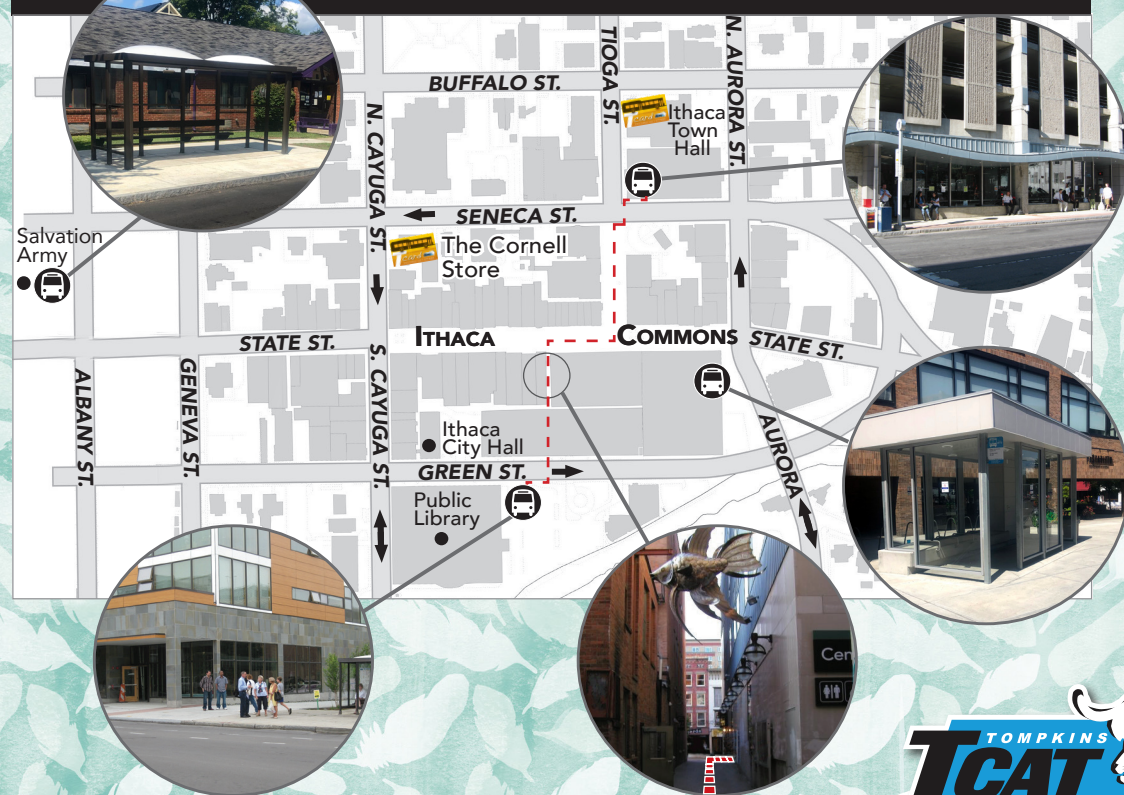

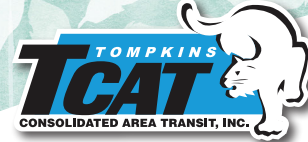

- Path through Parking Garage and The Commons connecting Green St. to Seneca St.

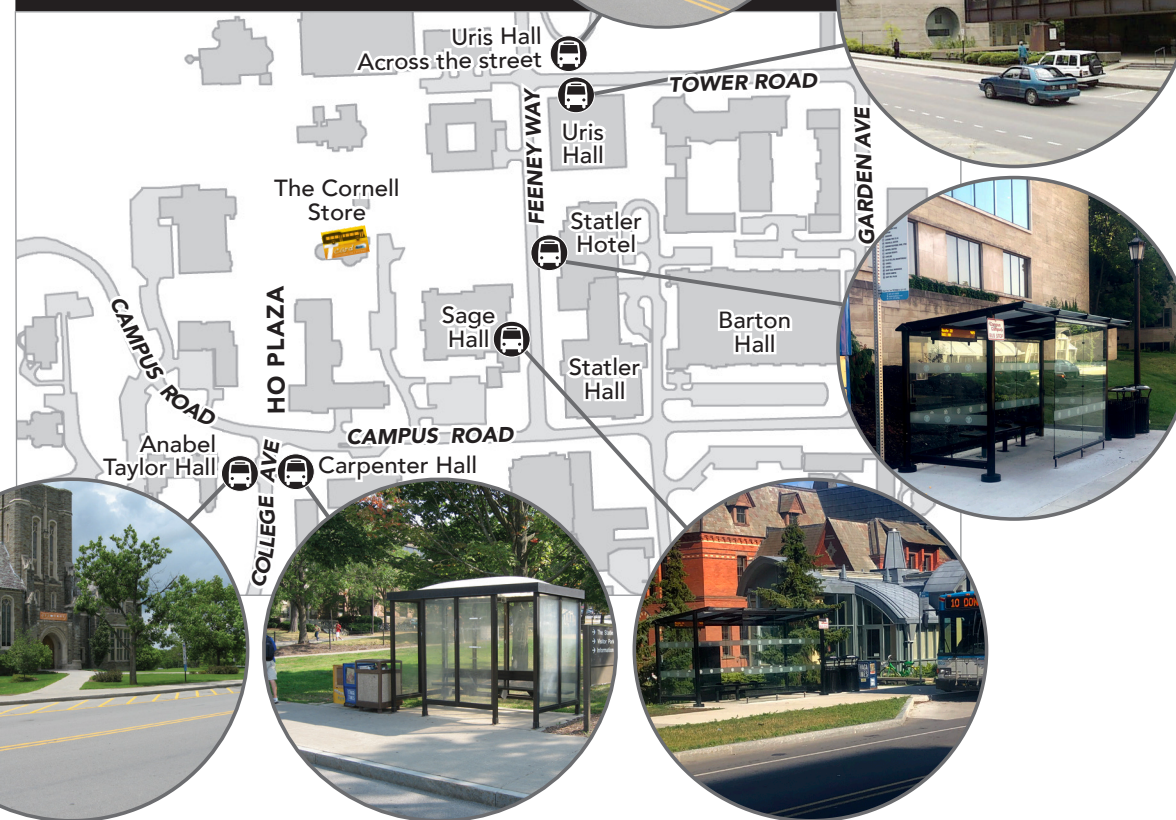


Making the Connection

Transfer Points

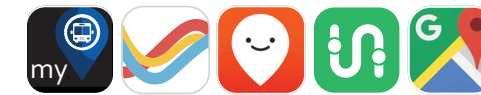
Sometimes you will need to take more than one bus to get to your destination. TCAT's main hub is centered in downtown Ithaca with 4 major stops on either side of the Ithaca Commons. Many TCAT routes start, end, or pass through the Commons area so chances are good that you can make a connection from one of the Commons Stops. There are also hubs on Cornell Campus.

Where do I get information?

Our website at www.tcatbus.com is the best place to find everything you need to ride the bus: access schedules; view maps; buy passes from our online store; or check out the MyStop Bus Tracker and trip planner desktop tool. Choose from a selection of excellent mobile apps and use your smartphone to view real-time locations or plan a trip using MyStop; Ithaca Transit-Live; Moovit; Transit or Google apps, available from Google Play and iTunes.



No smart phone?

How to Ride

1. Plan your trip by using online tools and apps. Online: visit the MyStop Bus Tracker website at: realtimetcatbus.availtec.com/ Click on tables on left of screen to get information for routes, stops or to subscribe to alerts. Apps: Get the **MyStop** app or other apps on the App store or Google Play. Or you can see all the schedules at www.tcatbus.com/bus-schedules.

2. To interpret schedules look at the letters and their corresponding names in each column going across the schedule. These are timepoints that which show what times the bus picks up and drops off at major stops along any given bus route. If your stop is in between two timepoints, use the earlier time.

3. Determine the direction you are going. In general, **outbound** means away from downtown and **inbound** means heading toward downtown. Exceptions are routes that travel in a loop.

4. Make sure you **arrive at your bus stop a few minutes before** your scheduled departure time. TCAT bus stops are light blue with the TCAT logo, shown here.

5. Sometimes you will need to **transfer** buses to complete a single trip. When you board and pay the fare, ask your bus driver for a transfer slip to board the next bus without having to pay again. Make sure you time your transfers so that you will have time to board the next bus to your destination.

6. Select routes offer **"one-seat" rides** with one route changing into another route so there is no need to get off the bus to transfer. You can check if a route will change into another by looking at the far right column, which — if a one-seat ride — will say: **"Continues at Route #"**



10 Reasons to take TCAT

- 1. It's CHEAPER.** No parking fees, no fuel costs, no parking tickets. **Use your CU ID card at the fare box for unlimited rides on TCAT buses with OmniRide!** New-to-Cornell students matriculating for the first time receive free, automatic OmniRide privileges valid within their first academic year. Returning students may purchase OmniRide, available from Cornell Transportation Services, 116 Maple Ave. or online at www.myparking.cornell.edu
- 2. ONE SEAT RIDES.** Go farther without the hassle of transferring from one bus to another. We change the route sign and you stay on the bus. That means more time to do what you want without interruption.
- 3. PARKING SPACES.** You won't have to become a parking space stalker. Driving around hunting for a parking space is time consuming and stressful.
- 4. GET TO KNOW SOMEONE NEW.** Going to parties isn't the only way to meet people. Socializing on the bus is a great opportunity to network.
- 5. MORE FUN.** Let TCAT be the designated driver.
- 6. STAY FIT.** Walking to and from public transit can help you get the recommended amount of daily exercise to maintain an active lifestyle and to avoid the "Freshman 15".
- 7. PARALLEL PARKING.** On a hill at 1am. Enough said.
- 8. RELAX.** Leave the driving to TCAT and have time to read, study, text, do the crossword, or listen to music
- 9. SNOW.** You won't have dig your car out of a snow bank or worry about getting home safely in a storm.
- 10. LESS STRESS.** Instead of getting frustrated with traffic, you can get a jump on your homework.
